AGCID, through its South-South Cooperation Program and partnerships with chilean higher education institutions, promotes and executes differents human capital training programs, focusing on masters and undergraduate studies. Additionally, it offers short-term programs through student and academic mobility, as well as international diplomas and courses aimed at professionals and technicians from Latin America and the Caribbean, extending those initiatives to Africa and Asia.
