

HUMAN CAPITAL TRAINING PROGRAM

CHILEAN AGENCY FOR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION FOR DEVELOPMENT


Since 1993, Chile has made **human capital** development a central part of its international cooperation efforts. AGCID, through its South-South Cooperation Program and partnerships with Chilean higher education institutions, promotes and executes different human capital training programs, focusing on masters and undergraduate studies. Additionally, it offers short-term programs through student and academic mobility, as well as international diplomas and courses aimed at professionals and technicians from Latin America and the Caribbean, extending those initiatives to Africa and Asia.

POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMS




AGCID offers scholarships for masters studies to professionals who work in the public sector, non-governmental organizations, higher education institutions, and other relevant fields. These scholarships are also available to those with work experience in their desired field of study at the masters level.

 **Republic of Chile:** Scholarships for professionals from Latin America and the Caribbean.

 **Republic of Chile - Nelson Mandela Program:** Scholarships for professionals from African countries.

The calls for applications are annual and are published on the AGCID website.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

 **Transboundary Integration Scholarships (BIT in Spanish):** These are for undergraduate students from Bolivia and Peru, in partnership with the University of Tarapacá (Arica campus), and for students from Argentine Patagonia, in partnership with the University of Magallanes (Punta Arenas campus).




Annual calls are published on the universities and AGCID websites.



 **Pacific Alliance Academic Mobility:** This program offers reciprocity scholarships for undergraduate and postgraduate exchanges in Chile, Colombia, Mexico, and Peru. Each country provides up to 100 scholarships annually: 75 for undergraduate students (excluding their country of origin) for one academic semester, and 25 for doctoral internships for professors and researchers, ranging from one month to two academic semesters at accredited universities with existing agreements.


Annual announcements are made on the focal points websites and www.alianzapacifico.net website.



 **Manuela Sáenz Program:** This program supports undergraduate student mobility in Chilean universities for students from Ecuador and Paraguay who have completed half of their studies. Annual calls for applications are available on the AGCID website and the focal points of both countries (Ecuador's Secretariat of Higher Education, Science, Technology, and Innovation, and Paraguay's Technical Planning Secretariat and Social Development).




INTERNATIONAL COURSES (BILATERAL AND TRIANGULAR)


 In collaboration with **Chilean national institutions**, we offer courses in institutional strengthening, social development, and environmental issues, targeting professionals and executives from Latin America and the Caribbean.

 With the **CARICOM** network, we offer courses for learning the Spanish language.



 The **KIZUNA II Program**, developed with Japan, focuses on building resilient and sustainable societies in Latin America and the Caribbean. It covers disaster risk reduction at national and local levels, addressing issues such as earthquakes, fires, tsunamis, structural integrity, and floods.



 With **African countries**, we offer courses and diplomas in Public Policy Strengthening and Management and Aquaculture Production.

 With **Singapore and Thailand**, we develop courses and workshops on the exchange of best practices in public management, transparency, state modernization, e-government, and other related fields.
